Majority of New Mexicans Reject Trump's Hate-Based Agenda

Community leaders, elected officials, and faith leaders vow to continue the fight to keep families together and embrace New Mexico's legacy of immigrant integration and diversity

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. – Following the contentious election of Donald J. Trump as the new president of the United States, community members, leaders, allies and elected officials held a press conference organized by El CENTRO de Igualdad y Derechos to demonstrate that the politics of fear, hate, and xenophobia do not resonate with the majority of New Mexicans. Participants called on all lawmakers, regardless of party affiliation, to stand together and protect families in their communities who have made so many economic and cultural contributions in the State of New Mexico and across the nation.

Bertha Campos, a single mother of a mixed status family, a small business owner, and community leader with El CENTRO said, "A new era for our struggle has begun. We will be more resilient than ever and we will work tirelessly to protect our communities from senseless family separation and being the targets of discrimination and violence. We are not alone, we are united, and we are here to stay."

Gabriela Hernández, National LGBTQ Organizer for United We Dream / NM Dream Team reiterated the resilience and strength of immigrant communities, "Our immigrant community is ready to protect and mobilize our families, our community and our neighborhoods against hate. We are declaring a state of urgency and resilience for all of us, people of color, women, immigrants, refugees, faith, LGBTQ communities and allies. We will work together and protect each other. This is our home and we are here to stay."

New Mexico State Legislator Javier Martinez, (D- District 11) reminded attendees that New Mexico didn't vote to put Trump into the White House, "Trump doesn't represent the values of the majority of New Mexicans. We have a proud legacy in New Mexico of passing policies that are conducive to immigrant integration and to upholding the civil rights of all New Mexicans, regardless of their country of origin, immigration status, or religious beliefs. I will be reaching out to New Mexicans and elected officials, regardless of political affiliation, across the state that are committed to upholding this legacy and to ensure that the communities that are most vulnerable to attacks by the Trump administration aren't victims of discrimination, exploitation, violence, and family separation."
